**Denver in 2015?**

The ACBL board voted to approve management's recommendation to pursue negotiations to hold the 2015 Fall NABC in Denver November 26-December 6. This is not yet a "done deal," but prospects are very promising!

Headquarters Update: Construction of our new ACBL headquarters building is well underway. We expect to be moved into our new quarters in early March, 2010, and the warehouse will be relocated there by the end of January.

Since my last article, I attended the district board meetings at our regional in Ruidoso, New Mexico. There is sadness that this was perhaps the last regional tournament there, as it was a great tournament site and the volunteers there did a terrific job. The volunteers at all of our tournaments are special, and are a big reason our regionals and sectionals are fun and successful. A "thank you" from those of us who attend is always appreciated. Following Ruidoso, I went to three regionals in the northeast; Danbury, Conn., Buffalo, New York and Lancaster, Penn. In Danbury, we ran into our first snowstorm of the season, but it didn't dampen the enthusiasm of the players at the tournament. They had a nice turnout, and I attended a District 3 board meeting. From there I went to Buffalo, where the weather was actually quite nice. While hospitality is terrific everywhere I've been, I think the apex is Buffalo. They had food and drink between and after every session, had a hospitality room open throughout, and had an amazing variety of section top prizes. This is not a large tournament, but it was great. Lancaster is about an hour out of Philadelphia, and the regional there is held in a site with an unbelievable amount of playing space. Again all the players and I were treated to exceptional hospitality. While still a large tournament, it is my understanding that the attendance here has slowly been dropping. An added benefit was being able to observe the fantastic fall foliage in New England and the Northeast!

I accepted an invitation from Guillermo Poplawsky, a popular director from Mexico who has worked many of our tournaments, to attend the Mexican Regional in Puerto Vallarta. What a fantastic setting! The host hotel is right on the Pacific Ocean, and the weather was warm (hot) and very enjoyable. The playing area was festive with different colored tablecloths on every table and the same on all the chairs. When we weren't playing bridge we wandered all over town and had a terrific visit, experiencing none of the problems that have made news for the past several months.

Game times are different! The afternoon session was at 2:30 p.m., and the evening session started at 8:30. The tournament was well run and very enjoyable.

Like other tournaments I've attended, they don't hold back when it comes to hospitality for the players. The tournament is small, probably because there is not a large Mexican bridge community and because not too many people from the US attend. There were lots of Canadians there. I highly recommend it!

Following this tournament, I get to spend a few days at home before leaving for the NABC in San Diego. There I chaired the last board meeting of my term as ACBL President. **ABTA Master Point Press Teacher of the Year Award**



Not every bridge teacher has authored a bestseller, written a newspaper column, or become well-known enough to receive an entry in the Encyclopedia of Bridge. Nevertheless, there are many teachers who continue to inspire their students day in and day out, promoting the game in their community and answering any question clearly, concisely and without judgment, whether it's about Roman Keycard Blackwood or simply, "What's a finesse?"

Their work too often goes unrecognized, yet it is vital to the future of the game.

Starting next year, thanks to Master Point Press, the world's largest publisher of books on bridge, and the American Bridge Teachers Association (ABTA), these anonymous-yet-praiseworthy mentors will finally have an annual award to call their own: the ABTA Master Point Press Teacher of the Year Award.

"This is really for the unsung heroes of the bridge world," Barbara Seagram, co-author of the best selling *25 Bridge Conventions You Should Know*, chair of the ABTA Teacher of the Year Committee, and a bridge teacher herself, said in a statement. "At last there is an award for those in the trenches."

To nominate someone, students are encouraged to e-mail one or two paragraphs to Seagram ([bseagram@ca.inter.net](mailto:bseagram@ca.inter.net)) explaining why their teacher deserves consideration. Nominees must have at least five

years teaching experience, and teach at least 75 hours a year. Nominations will close on April 1, 2010. The award will be given to a teacher who exemplifies what Seagram calls "love for the game." "They may not have a famous name, but ... their communication skills and enthusiasm promote bridge's future, adding to your enjoyment," Seagram said.

Master Point Press co-founder Ray Lee is "delighted" to be working with the ABTA to create the Teacher of the Year award.

"It is the bridge teachers who bring new people into the game, and we want to recognize their hard work and dedication," he said.

The first winner will be presented with a "Teacher of The Year" plaque and a cash award next July in New Orleans, at the ABTA's 2010 convention.

The ABTA is a professional organization of bridge teachers from Canada, Mexico and the USA. Its mandate is to help those who teach bridge to do it better.

Master Point Press is the world's largest publisher of books on contract bridge with more than 150 titles in print.
