**Editor's Desk**

**F**ootball (regular) season is September to February. Baseball season is April to October. Basketball season is October to June. And tournament bridge season? Well, that's pretty much all year round. No sooner does one bridge season end than another begins.

*Bridge, a Magnificent Obsession:* Having started to play duplicate bridge in the 1970s, one story in particular drove home the point that duplicate bridge players are dedicated to the game, obsessed even. In the mid-1970s, there was a national bridge tournament in Kansas City, Missouri. Five Denver area players, all fairly new to tournament bridge, piled into a car after work on a Friday afternoon and drove all night to get there. They played bridge the next two days, left Kansas City after the Sunday evening session, drove all night, and got back to Denver just in time (or maybe a little late) for work the following morning.

The following weekend they repeated the process.

I thought, here's an interesting game.

*On the Road Again:* Of course, there are many people who devote a great deal of time, money and energy to playing bridge much of the year at various tournaments around the country in the quest for masterpoints. As all readers of this publication know, the American Contract Bridge League has a variety of masterpoint contests, local, regional and national and for a wide variety of player rankings. Want to be the top nationwide masterpoint winner some year? That means topping the annual Barry Crane Top 500 list. Plan on the better part of the year on the road and winning at least 2,500 masterpoints, and some years even that won't be enough.

The top masterpoint winner in 1999, Jim Barrow, wrote an entire book, *Record Run*, about his year long quest for the title, an exhausting marathon he did not try to repeat. He pretty much played bridge the entire year to win with a record setting total of 3,584 masterpoints.

*A Book You Can't Buy:* One of the great unfinished bridge books of all time was going to be a history of the late, great Barry Crane's various runs for what used to be called the McKenney Trophy. Crane, a noted Hollywood television director and producer, was usually in contention from the fifties until his untimely death in 1985. He had six McKenney wins and five seconds.

**S**ue Emery, editor of the *ACBL Bulletin* from 1972-1996, was working on the book before her retirement from the ACBL. Other top players were to have made contributions, but things were delayed and the book was never published. A great loss to the history of bridge.
